### LEARNING OUTCOMES

We will study various invariants of singularities, especially in the case of hypersurfaces. We will emphasize explicit computations, and to keep our discussions concrete, we will often focus on plane algebroid curves. After completing this course, students will know the basics of the Minor number, the Bernstein-Sato polynomial, and Frobenius thresholds. Students will also learn how to compute each of these invariants in some important special cases.

## EVALUATION CRITERIA AND GRADING SCALE

Grades will be determined by attendance records, and by the outcome of any student presentations. There is no formal grading scale.
